Essay Questions – Personal Essay (25 points)

A personal essay of 300 to 500 words is worth 25% of your scholarship application score. This assignment asks you to describe and reflect upon your own personal, real life experience and explain your own opinions and ideas. This is not a research assignment.

In order to do well on this essay, you should:

- Understand the topic and stick to it
- Describe real life events in clear detail with specific examples
- Use paragraphs to progress from one idea to the next
- Write well-organized, grammatically correct sentences in English
- Give your essay an interesting title
- Show your own unique and creative style

Please choose one of the following essay topics. Then carefully read the instructions below.

1. Like the rest of the world, everyone at RIT Croatia is now into the second year of living with the global Covid pandemic. We are in the process of adjusting to the "new normal" of a combination of online learning and traditional in

person classes. Reflect honestly on your own experiences with these two modes of learning. Do you have a preference? What do you personally feel are the advantages of each approach for the quality of your learning? What changes would you suggest to professors and the college leadership in planning for the future? In your answer, please use specific examples of situations that you actually experienced to illustrate your points.

2. Nearly every course at RIT Croatia includes some points for class participation. Yet, students sometimes are not sure what "participation" means, or how these points are distributed. What is your opinion/experience with these points? What can professors do to make sure these points are awarded fairly? What should students do to earn these points? Should class participation be included as part of the grade at all?
3. For many people, one of the most valuable aspects of a college education is the learning and growth that occur outside the classroom. What do you feel you have learned in your time at RIT Croatia, beyond the academic content of your courses? Consider the people you have met, challenges you have faced, and activities you have chosen during your time as an RIT Croatia student. How has your college experience helped you develop as a person?

Instructions:

- Type your essay in English and submit it as a text file attachment along with your scholarship application. Submit in one of the following file formats: Word (.doc or .docx), Open Office (.odt), Rich Text Format (.rtf), Portable Document Format (.pdf)
- Type your full name on the top left corner of the first page only. It will be removed for anonymous grading.
- Your essay should be 300 to 500 words, double spaced, 2.5 cm margins all sides, Times New Roman 12pt
- **This essay must be your own, original work, written by you alone.** Your essay will be checked using plagiarism prevention software. Do not copy parts of other essays into your own text. If your essay turns out to be wholly or partly plagiarized, your scholarship application will be rejected.
- If you have previously written about the selected topic for any of your RIT Croatia courses, please indicate this in your paper.
- All submissions must be carefully spellchecked and proofread. Any essay which is not spellchecked will not be accepted.

Work carefully! If your essay does not meet all the above criteria, your scholarship application will not be considered.

Application Review Process

A Scholarship Committee consisting of a number of faculty and staff members reviews all applications and ranks students based on a weighted score.

Total of 100 points are:

GPA (75 points), OPTIONAL volunteer work (10 points) and essay (25 points)

Please note that if you are using volunteering points, GPA points will drop by 2 points for each volunteering activity used:
For example if someone volunteers on CED activity then their GPA is 73 points, volunteer work 2 points and essay 25 points.

Each component carries points that are allocated by the Committee. Points for GPA and volunteer work are derived from a straight formula while points for the other components have a degree of subjective determination by the Committee built into their total. For example, faculty and staff evaluation may influence the score an applicant receives. Essay component will be based on a blind review of both Dubrovnik and Zagreb Campus Faculty members.

The Scholarships are awarded to those students who have the highest percentages after the weighted formula is calculated. If you have any questions about the scholarship awards or the process itself, please feel free to contact Finances.

Only complete applications will be considered.

Distribution Ratios

RIT Croatia Scholarships will be awarded based on below distribution diagram. The distribution is based on enrolment percentages of each program in previous academic years.

RIT Croatia Scholarships are awarded for full time studies (12-17 credits). If a student does not meet full time requirements for Fall or Spring Semester, scholarship amount will be prorated. For example, if a student is registered for 10 credit hrs in Fall semester, and 15 credit hrs in Spring semester his/her scholarship would be 416,66Eur for Fall ($500,00 / 12 * 10$) and 500,00Eur for Spring semester.
